About The Trust

Escambia Children's Trust, an Independent Special District of Escambia County, Florida was established pursuant to §125.901, Fla. Stat. and Escambia County Ordinance § 2020-22, and approved by the Electorate on November 3, 2020. The purpose of the ECT is to invest in the well-being of children within Escambia County by maximizing resources and ensuring accountability through investment in and support of community provider programs through a competitive review process.

The ECT Board approved a budget which will levy a .5 mill of property tax generating approximately \$10 million in revenue for ECT in the first year, with the ability to levy up to .5 mills each year for the initial 10-year life span.
